#### **BACKGROUND**

- October 9, 2018: City Council direction for comprehensive amendment of Municipal Code
- October 23, 2018: Initiated City Council introduction of Title 1 (General Provisions) and Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.04
- November 1, 2018: QCP completed initial review of entire Municipal Code
- November 14, 2018: City Council adopts amendments to Title 1 and Title 2, Chapter 2.04
- July 9, 2019: adopted revisions to remainder of Title 2 (Administration and Personnel) and all of Title 3 (Revenue and Finance)

- > Title 4: seventeen Chapters
- > No proposed amendments to four Chapters
  - > 4.08 (Dance and Entertainment Events)
  - > 4.20 (Regulation of Vehicle Vendors)
  - > 4.28 (Automatic Burglar Alarm Telephone Devices)
  - > 4.56 (Distribution of Written Materials)
- > Proposed repeal of Chapter 4.48 (Item Pricing)
  - > Preempted by state law

- Proposed minor amendments to nine Chapters to conform to state law and other wording changes
  - > Chapter 4.04 (Amusement Facilities)
  - > Chapter 4.24 (Private Parking Facilities)
  - > Chapter 4.32 (Private Patrols)
  - > Chapter 4.36 (Gambling Clubs)
  - > Chapter 4.40 (Massage Businesses)
  - > Chapter 4.42 (Pawnbrokers Secondhand Dealers)
  - > Chapter 4.44 (Environmental Health Code)
  - > Chapter 4.52 (Trailers and Trailer Courts)
  - > Chapter 4.68 (Escort Services)

- > Proposed substantive revisions to three Chapters
- > Chapter 4.16 (Peddlers)
  - Revisions for consistency with new state law and Chapter 4.18 (Pushcart and Sidewalk Vendors)
  - Proposed addition of "Do Not Knock" registry
    - Voluntary resident registration with City Clerk; peddlers must comply as a condition of permit
    - Applies to those who sell goods and services, not charities or those engaged in political speech

- > Chapter 4.18 (Pushcart and Sidewalk Vendors)
  - > New state law generally limits local authority
    - > Purpose: incentivize individuals selling food to public
    - > Proposed ordinance includes all requirements allowed by state law
      - Requires permits, insurance, ADA and health/safety compliance
      - Prohibits stationary sidewalk vendors in all residential zones and near Certified Farmers' Markets, Swap Meets, or other events held pursuant to a Special Event Permit
      - Must allow stationary vendors in parks unless formal concessionaire

- > Roaming vendors in parks
  - > State law apparently prohibits outright ban
  - > State law allows reasonable TPM regulations
    - Proposed: comply with all other ordinance requirements plus discontinue vending one hour before park closure
    - > No additional regulations at this time

- > Chapter 4.60 (Bingo)
  - > State law now prescribes allowable fee (\$50), prohibits gross receipts tax
    - City can continue to receive rent for facility rental and other cost reimbursement from NSC
  - > State law allows discretion regarding number of games
    - > Currently four per week at Senior Center
    - Proposed change for consistency, plus City Council discretion for one additional game per week
