# County COVID-19 Statistics



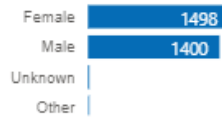
## San Mateo County COVID-19 Data Dashboard

Case data up to and including June 22, 2020

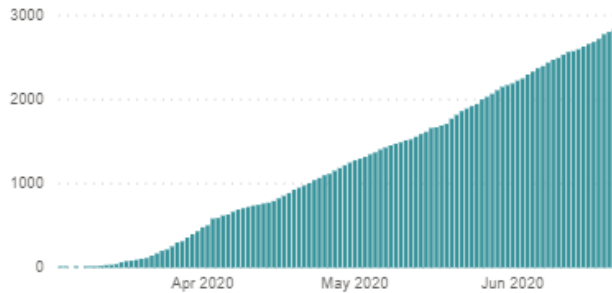

### Total Cases by Day

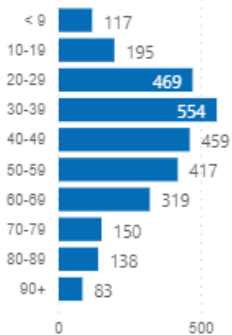

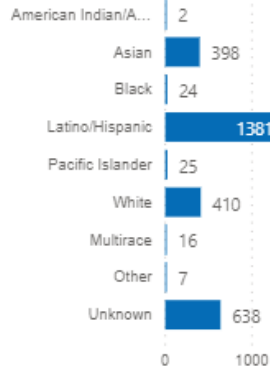
### Deaths by Gender



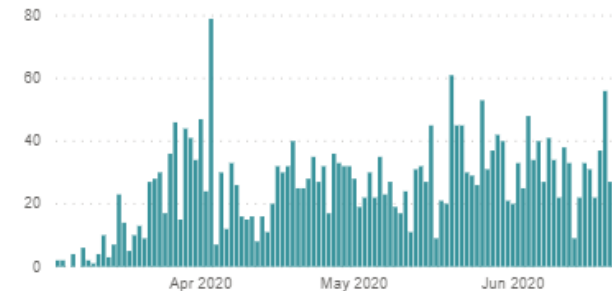
### Cases by Age Group



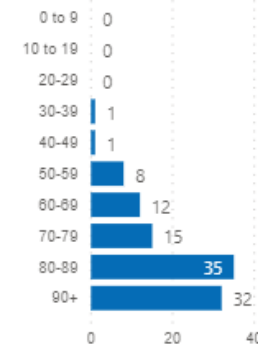
### Cases by Race/Ethnicity



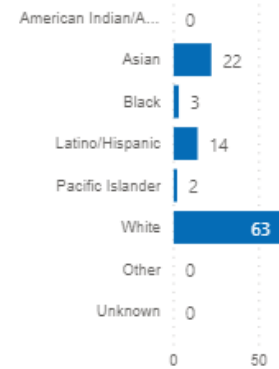
### New Cases by Day



### Deaths by Age Group

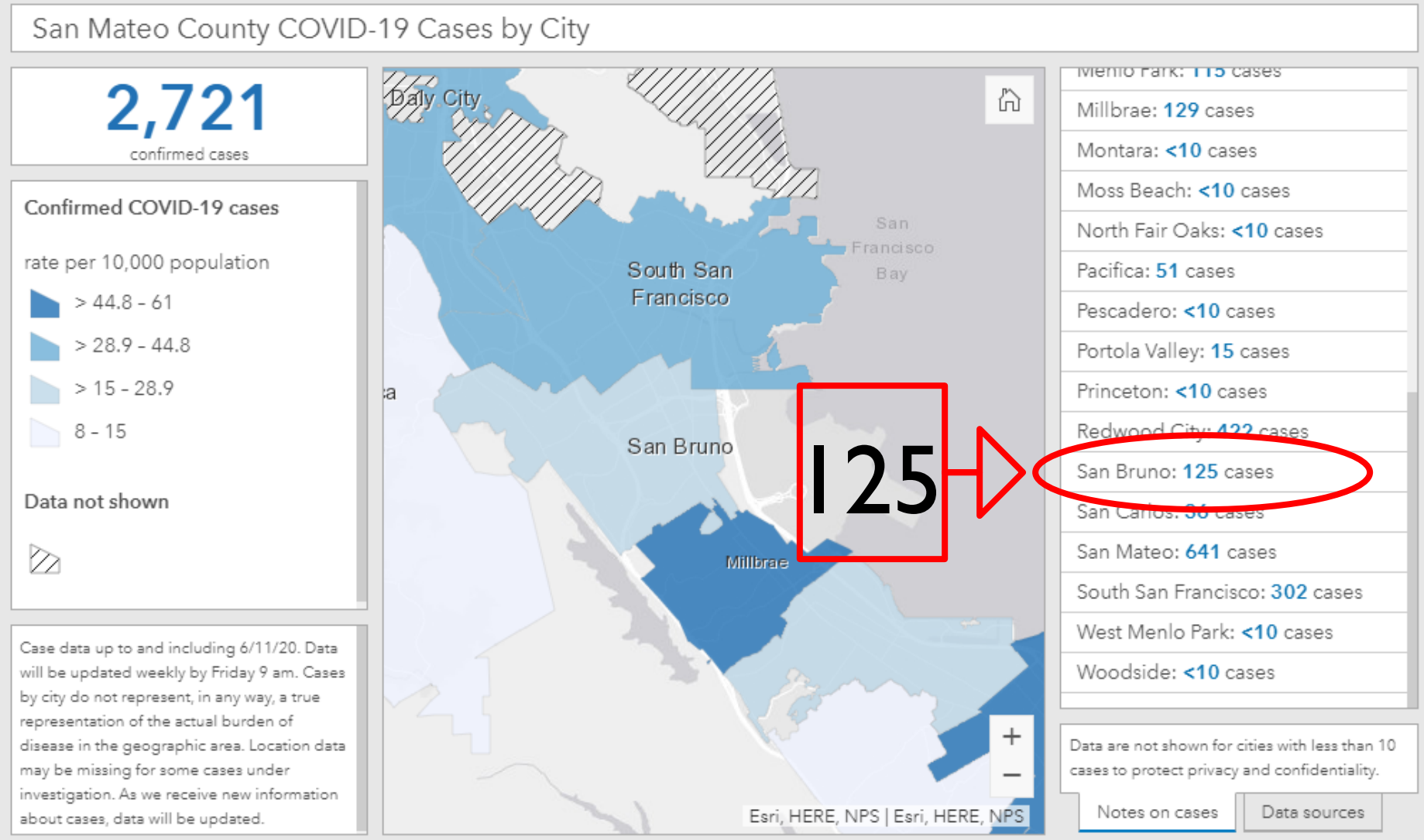


### Deaths by Race/Ethnicity



Because of limited testing capacity, the number of cases detected through testing represents only a small portion of the total number of likely cases in the County. COVID-19 data are reported as timely, accurately, and completely as we have available. Data are updated as we receive information that is more complete and will change over time as we learn more. Cases are lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases reported to San Mateo County Public Health by providers, commercial laboratories, and academic laboratories, including reporting results through the California Reportable Disease Information Exchange. A lab-confirmed case is defined as detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA in a clinical specimen using a molecular amplification detection test. Cases are counted by date the lab result was reported. Death data last updated June 22, 2020.

# Shelter in Place Order

## ▲ Rescinded and Replaced Effective June 17, 2020

- Aligns County of San Mateo with State's [Resilience Roadmap](#)
- Limits gatherings to no more than 50 people
- Requires business to implement social distancing protocol and health and safety plans
- Allows for social bubbles
- Social distancing and face covering requirements remain in effect





# Resilience Roadmap Stage 2

- ▲ **Additional Allowable Businesses/Activities** *(with health and safety plans in place)*
  - Dine-in restaurants
  - Hair salons and barber shops
  - Casinos
  - Family entertainment centers
  - Restaurants, wineries and bars
  - Zoos and museums
  - Gyms and fitness centers
  - Hotels (for tourism and individual travel)
  - Cardrooms and racetracks
  - Campgrounds and outdoor recreation
  - Nail salons, body waxing, and tattoo parlors were allowed to resume operations effective June 19, 2020



# Health Officer's Word of Caution

*“We are moving away from opening businesses according to certain categories and instead focusing on behaviors and practices,”* said Dr. Scott Morrow.

*“As we ease restrictions, the power to control the spread of the virus lies with individuals and communities. Collective behavior will determine our destiny. If enough people, businesses, or organizations in the community do not follow the protective recommendations, the virus may spread with abandon.”*

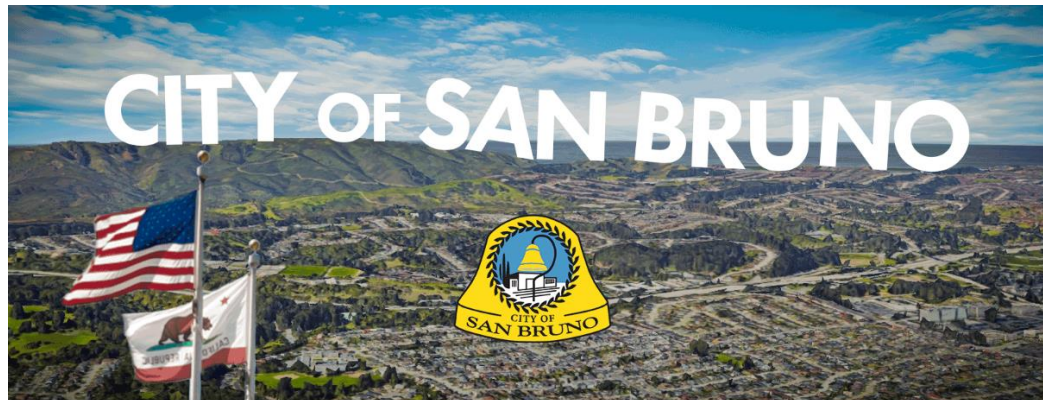
